Slum Ministry in Nepal

This little church, built in the slums of Kathmandu, Nepal was destroyed by city construction crews as they prepare to build a retaining wall beside the river. Also gone are the toilets behind the church and the widow's home—a simple shelter attached to the church which provided housing for 3 Christian widows. The church was (and is) thriving with about 100 regular weekly attenders—people from among the poorest of the poor in the city.

The partners and believers on the ground in Nepal have already found a place to rebuild.

We need about \$10,000 to replace what has been lost.

The words from Pastor Daniel, our partner in Nepal for the slum ministry.....

We like to update you that we are going through the critical situation in our community, that nearly 100 houses has been removed by the riverside retaining wall projects in the riverside, Government is making plan for the retaining wall along the riverside of the both sides of river and rivers width would be keep for 50 meter between two sides which is the reason our nearly 100 houses would be going to replace somewhere inside the community, People are trying to save their things like bricks, Tins, Plastics tents and bamboos for their reuse, it is very much horrible condition for the Slum communities because they are very much poor and the situation comes against their situation

This is how community people are trying to make shelter from themselves. People trying to put the bamboo to make shelter for their family, they are strongly under needs of plastic tents, bamboos, mattress and many more things for their new house settlement, and bad things is that today it is raining in here and they are facing very much difficulties, coldness and many problems.

When there is no rains our community is full of dusty and when it rains it is full of muddy, in the middle of the road it seems like water ponds, So this is great challenges for the family to stay over here, But we don't have another option besides to struggle here.

This riverside retaining wall project not took only our communities nearly 100 houses, but also it took our school's 3 rooms, all the school and church's toilets, and whole the church building, So we are very much struggling for this time, where to use toilets, for school children and for the church fellowship, Because our whole church building has gone including our old age women care centers cottage also gone....
